To amend section 318 of the Communications Act of 1934.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That section 318 of the Communications Act of 1934 is
4 hereby amended to read as follows:
5 “SEC. 318. The actual operation of all transmitting ap-
6 paratus in any radio station for which a station license is
7 required by this Act shall be carried on only by a person
8 holding an operator’s license issued hereunder, and no per-
9 son shall operate any such apparatus in such station except
10 under and in accordance with an operator’s license issued to
11 him by the Commission: *Provided, however,* That the Com-
12 mission may waive or modify the foregoing provisions of

1 this section for the operation of any station except (1)
2 stations for which licensed operators are required by inter-
3 national agreement, (2) stations for which licensed oper-
4 ators are required for safety purposes, (3) stations engaged
5 in broadcasting, and (4) stations operated as common car-
6 riers on frequencies below thirty thousand kilocycles.”
