OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY

Committee on Education and Labor: General Subcommittee on Labor held a hearing on H.R. 11192 and 11451, to encourage the development, initiation, and expansion of occupational safety programs in the States through grants to States for such purposes. Testimony was given by public witnesses.

SCHOOL INTEGRATION

Committee on Education and Labor: Subcommittee on Integration in Federally Assisted Education met in executive session and ordered reported favorably to the full committee H.R. 9824 (a clean bill to be introduced), to eliminate the provisions thereof authorizing Federal contributions for the maintenance of schools of higher education in which racial segregation is practiced; and H.R. 10056, relating to construction and maintenance and operation of public schools in federally impacted areas, to deny payments to school districts which are not in compliance with constitutional requirements that public schools be operated on a racially nondiscriminatory basis.

FOREIGN AID

Committee on Foreign Affairs: Met in executive session to continue markup of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1962. No announcements were made and markup will continue, in executive session, Thursday, May 3.

BAKER RECLAMATION PROJECTS

Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs: Subcommittee on Irrigation and Reclamation met in executive session on H.R. 575, relating to the upper division of the Baker Federal reclamation project, Oregon. Adjourned subject to call of the Chair.

NATIONAL CAPITAL AIRPORTS CORPORATION

Committee on Interstate and Foreign Commerce: Subcommittee on Transportation and Aeronautics heard testimony from Representative Broyhill and Najeeb E. Halaby, Administrator, Federal Aviation Agency, on H.R. 7399, to create the National Capital Airports Corporation, to provide for the operation of the federally owned civil airports in the District of Columbia or its vicinity.

PRIVATE CLAIMS—1202D CIVIL AFFAIRS GROUP

Committee on the Judiciary: Subcommittee No. 2, in executive session, ordered reported favorably to the full committee H.R. 9199, for the relief of certain officers and enlisted personnel of the 1202d Civil Affairs Group

(Reinf Tng), Fort Hamilton, Brooklyn, N.Y. Also took action on several private claim bills.

The subcommittee took testimony on private claim bills, in an open hearing, prior to the executive session.

COASTWISE TRADE

Committee on Merchant Marine and Fisheries: The Subcommittee on Coast Guard, Coast and Geodetic Survey, and Navigation, in executive session, ordered reported favorably to the full committee H.R. 8168 (amended), to admit the oil screw tugs *Barbara, Ivalee, Lydia, and Alice* and the barges *Florida, DB8, Number 220, and Number 235* to American registry and to permit their use in the coastwise trade while they are owned by Standard Dredging Corp., a New Jersey corporation; H.R. 6456 (amended), to permit the tugs *John Roen, Jr., and Steve W.* to be documented for use in the coastwise trade; H.R. 6219, to permit the vessel *Bar-Ho IV* to be used in the coastwise trade; and H.R. 7741, to permit the vessel *Lucky Linda* to be documented for limited use in the coastwise trade.

Prior to taking action on the measures the subcommittee held an open hearing and heard testimony from Representatives Dooley (H.R. 6219 and 8168); Pike (H.R. 7741), and Judd (H.R. 6456); departmental witnesses (all measures); and a public witness (H.R. 8168).

MID-DECADE CENSUS

Committee on Post Office and Civil Service: Subcommittee on Census and Government Statistics continued hearings on H.R. 1100, regarding a mid-decade census. Heard Representatives Johnson of California and Korney; all various public witnesses.

HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION AUTHORIZATION

Committee on Public Works: Subcommittee on Roads concluded hearings on H.R. 11199, and related bills, to authorize appropriations for the construction of certain highways. Testimony was given by Representatives Harris, Trimble, and Johnson of California; also public witnesses.

MINING CLAIM

Committee on Rules: Granted an open rule, with 1 hour of debate, on S. 383, to provide for the acquisition of a patented mining claim on the south rim of Grand Canyon National Park.

Testimony was given on the request for a rule by Representatives Aspinall and Rutherford.

ARBUCKLE RECLAMATION PROJECT

Committee on Rules: Granted an open rule, with 1 hour of debate, on H.R. 23, regarding the Arbutle reclamation project, Oklahoma.

Heard testimony on the request for a rule from Representatives Aspinall, Albert, and Edmondson.

HIGHER EDUCATION

Committee on Rules: Granted a rule providing for sending to conference H.R. 8900, to authorize assistance to public and other nonprofit institutions of higher education.

NASA AUTHORIZATION

Committee on Science and Astronautics: The committee in executive session heard subcommittee reports on H.R. 10100, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration authorization bill. No announcements were made.

TRADE EXPANSION ACT

Committee on Ways and Means: Met in executive session on H.R. 9900, the Trade Expansion Act of 1962. No announcements were made, and the committee recessed until Thursday, May 3.
