FCC ANNOUNCES TENTATIVE AGENDA FOR AUGUST 22 OPEN MEETING

Washington, D.C. – Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Chairman Kevin J. Martin has circulated the following items for consideration by his fellow FCC Commissioners as part of the tentative agenda for the next open meeting scheduled for Friday, August 22, 2008:

- Roaming – A Memorandum Opinion and Order on Reconsideration that addresses issues raised in petitions for reconsideration of the Roaming Report and Order.
- Low Power Auxiliary Stations in the 700 MHz Band – Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) and Order regarding the operation of broadcast low power auxiliary stations (including wireless microphones) within the 700 MHz Band.
- NET 911 – An NPRM that seeks comment on implementing the New and Emerging Technologies (NET) 911 Improvement Act of 2008.
- Universal Service – A Notice of Inquiry that seeks comment on ways to improve the management and administration of the Universal Service Fund.
- Carriage of Digital Television Broadcast Signals – An Amendment to Part 76 of the Commission’s Rules, Fourth Report & Order.
- Fireside Media – An Order concerning Fireside Media and its participation in Auction No. 37.
- DTV – Notice of Apparent Liability for Forfeiture and Order for DTV Tuner Violation.

Topics selected for open meeting agendas are made public and posted on the Commission’s website approximately three weeks prior to the Commission’s next monthly meeting. The Commission will continue to issue a public notice of the “Commission Meeting Agenda” one week before the meeting and announce at that time the items that are scheduled for the agenda.
