Dear Mr. Jackson:

Thank you for your interest in participating on the Federal Communications Commission's federal advisory committee, the North American Numbering Council (NANC or Council). We are pleased to accept your nomination on behalf of the Office of Utilities Regulation, Jamaica (OUR) and invite you to become a voting member of the Council effective immediately. It is our understanding that the OUR will fully fund the expenses for your active participation on the Council

Your status as a voting member of the NANC is deemed to be that of a representative of consumers of telecommunications and not as a "special government employee." We welcome you as a voting member of the Council and request that you attend the next NANC meeting to be held on Tuesday, June 20 and Wednesday, June 21, 2000. The meeting will be held at the Federal Communications Commission, 445 12<sup>th</sup> Street, S.W., Room TW-C305, Washington, DC 20554. We hope that you will be able to attend.

On July 13, 1995, the Commission announced the establishment of the NANC as the foundation of a new model for administration of the North American Numbering Plan (NANP). The purpose of the NANC is to provide the Commission with advice and recommendations reached through consensus to foster efficient and impartial number administration as telecommunications competition continues to emerge. One of the Commission's responsibilities is to ensure effective and fair administration of domestic numbering resources essential to realizing the benefits of an interconnected and interoperable public switched network. Such administration provides consumers efficient access to new telecommunications services and technologies and supports continued growth of an economy increasingly dependent upon those services and technologies.

To assist us in preparing the meeting arrangements, we ask that you provide us with the following information:
