# Administrative Notes

## ● TCB Audit Request

- Requesting audit mode not initiated by the FCC:
  - ✓ Why is it vital for demonstrating FCC compliance?
  - ✓ Identify the reason for what is to be changed.
  - ✓ Identify what and where the item is to change.

## ● Category Selection

- Reminder use the correct Categories.

## ● PAG vs MPAG

- Do not submit separate PAGs when multiple PAG process is applicable.



# Equipment Compliance Review (ECR)

- A new KDB “first category” named **Equipment Compliance Review (ECR)** will be introduced.
- This category includes all the inquiries that need to be submitted **because FCC policy**, as stated in various KDB Publications.
- ECR inquiries are not meant for general questions originating from inquirers, but **only** for providing specific information as requested by FCC policies in relation to some compliance aspect of equipment seeking authorization.



# Equipment Compliance Review (ECR)

- The ECR first category will have several sub-categories (or second category).
- Presently the following second categories under ECR are being considered:
  - **Persistent Inquiry Approval** → **Acceptance**: for new 6 GHZ policy (Session 3.6).
  - **Wireless Power Transfer**: as requested in the forthcoming KDB Publication 680106, both for SDoC and certification.
  - **Mobile/Portable Minimum Distance**: per forthcoming KDB 447498v07.
  - **Data referencing**: per forthcoming KDB Publication 484596 D01 v02.



# New Application Guidance (NAG)

- Another new first category named “**New Application Guidance**” (NAG) is for covering the requests for obtaining FCC concurrence for a product design that that requires a “PAG” and that will later be submitted for certification by a TCB.
- The NAG inquiry provides a level of confidence that an eventual PAG may be approved by FCC staff when submitted by the **TCB**.
- The NAG inquiry shall contain the same detail as would be required by the actual PAG item submitted by the TCB.



# New Application Guidance (NAG)

- The NAG first category will have several second categories.
- The applications that require PAG **may only refer to NAG** inquiry that received positive FCC reply.
- References to other “general” KDB replies **will not be considered valid**, except for those filed as NAG category before June 1, 2023.
- Any procedure, technical changes or changes to the conditions to the original acceptance will require a new NAG Inquiry.
- At the FCC discretion, the applicant may be requested to **re-file an older inquiry** under the new NAG category for the purpose of easier administration process.
