Dear Mr. Zhang,

The Laboratory Division of the Federal Communications Commission's Office of Engineering and Technology hereby notifies Global Compliance and Testing Center of Huawei Technologies Co., Ltd. ("Huawei Lab") of the suspension of its recognition and denial of the requested extension and renewal.

On November 11, 2022, the Commission adopted the EA Security Report and Order, Order, and Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (referenced herein as EA Security R&O, EA Security Order, and EA Security FNPRM, respectively). Specifically, the Commission established several new rules to prohibit authorization of "covered" communications equipment identified on the Commission's Covered List developed pursuant to the Secure Networks Act.

On November 25, 2022, the FCC released FCC 22-84 "Protecting Against National Security Threats to the Communications Supply Chain through the Equipment Authorization Program". FCC 22-84 prohibits the equipment authorization of telecommunications and video surveillance equipment by entities identified on the FCC Covered List. One of the entities named on the covered list is Huawei Technologies Company.


The Huawei Lab appears to be an affiliate of Huawei Technologies Company. The current recognition of the Huawei Lab expires on April 30, 2024. Please be advised that we have suspended the ability of this Huawei Lab to obtain renewal of recognition. Should the Huawei Lab seek reassessment and renewal, such renewal will not be granted. Further, we request that, within 30 days of the date of this correspondence, you show cause why FCC recognition of the Huawei Lab should not be permanently barred. In your response, please address, at a minimum, the following questions/requests:

1. What is the relationship between the Huawei Lab and Huawei Technologies Company?
2. Please provide detailed ownership information for the Huawei Lab.
3. From a review of equipment authorization grants in the FCC equipment authorization database it appears that all of the test reports received by the FCC from Global Compliance and Testing Center of Huawei Tec are associated with the grantees Huawei Device Co Ltd and Huawei Technologies Co. Ltd. Does Global Compliance

and Testing Center of Huawei Tec test devices to the FCC equipment authorization requirements for any companies other than Huawei? If so, please list all companies for which Huawei tests devices.

4. Provide any claimed justification as to why the FCC should continue to recognize the Huawei Lab.
