AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM

HOME INTERNET ACCESS IS IMPORTANT FOR EVERY STUDENT'S SUCCESS.

The Affordable Connectivity Program provides eligible households on qualifying Tribal lands with a \$75/month discount off their monthly internet bill. It also provides one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider when the eligible household contributes at least \$10 but less than \$50 toward the purchase.

You may qualify if your student receives free or reduced school lunch or breakfast!

Does your student participate in the Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision?

If the answer is Yes, your household is eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program.

You may also qualify if the household income is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines or participates in one of these assistance programs and lives on qualifying Tribal lands:

- Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance
- Tribal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)
- Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations
- Tribal Head Start (income based)

Lifeline program participants also automatically qualify for the Affordable Connectivity Program.

Two Steps to Enroll

Go to GetInternet.gov to submit an application or print a mail-in application.

2 Contact your preferred participating provider to select an eligible plan and have the discount applied to your bill.

Some providers may have an alternative application that they will ask you to complete ligible households must <u>both</u> apply for the program and contact a participating provider to select a service plan.
