

COULD YOU USE \$50 OFF YOUR HOME OR MOBILE INTERNET BILL?

The Emergency Broadband Benefit provides eligible households with up to a **\$50 discount** off their monthly internet bill during the pandemic.

If you received a Federal Pell Grant during the current academic year, you may qualify for the Emergency Broadband Benefit.

Didn't receive a Pell Grant? You may also qualify if a member of your household meets at least one of the criteria below:

- Has an income that is at or below 135% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines or participates in certain government assistance programs;
- Received benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch or breakfast program in school year 2019-2020, 2020-2021, or 2021-2022;
- Experienced a substantial loss of income due to job loss or furlough since February 29, 2020; or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income or COVID-19 program.

The benefit provides:

- An up to \$50/month discount for broadband services; and
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider.

Two-Steps to Enroll

- **Go to GetEmergencyBroadband.org** to submit an application or print out a mail-in application.
- 2 Contact your preferred participating provider to select an eligible plan and have the discount applied to your bill.

Some providers may have an alternative application that they will ask you to complete.
