

FCC ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS SUMMARY

The Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) funding is appropriated to the FCC by Congress and signed into law by the President through the annual appropriations process. The Continuing Appropriations and Ukraine Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2023 (Public Law No. 117-180) appropriated funding to the FCC through December 16, 2022 for Fiscal Year (FY) 2023. The funding level appropriated through December 16, 2022 is based on the funding level appropriated in the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2022 (Public Law No. 117-103). The actual pertinent text of the FCC's FY 2022 funding language is contained below under the FY 2022 Appropriations header.

Federal Communications Commission FY 2022 Appropriations

For necessary expenses of the Federal Communications Commission, as authorized by law, including uniforms and allowances therefor, as authorized by [5 U.S.C. 5901–5902](#); not to exceed \$4,000 for official reception and representation expenses; purchase and hire of motor vehicles; special counsel fees; and services as authorized by [5 U.S.C. 3109](#), \$381,950,000, to remain available until expended: *Provided*, That \$381,950,000 of offsetting collections shall be assessed and collected pursuant to section 9 of title I of the Communications Act of 1934, shall be retained and used for necessary expenses, and shall remain available until expended: *Provided further*, That the sum herein appropriated shall be reduced as such offsetting collections are received during fiscal year 2022 so as to result in a final fiscal year 2022 appropriation estimated at \$0: *Provided further*, That, notwithstanding [47 U.S.C. 309\(j\)\(8\)\(B\)](#), proceeds from the use of a competitive bidding system that may be retained and made available for obligation shall not exceed \$128,621,000 for fiscal year 2022: *Provided further*, That, of the amount appropriated under this heading, not less than \$11,854,000 shall be for the salaries and expenses of the Office of Inspector General.
