## Explanation of Effort and Availability of Commercial Equipment

No, my company has not conducted work on the removal of covered equipment since the submittal of the last form. Installation of the replacement equipment has not been completed. Removal will follow completion of installation of the replacement equipment. No, my company has not conducted work on the disposal of covered equipment since the submittal of the last form. We have not yet removed any covered equipment. Yes, my company has conducted work on the replacement of covered equipment and services since the submittal of the last form. We continue to work on turn-up of the new core. Ground prep work on 1 of 67 tower sites started in December 2022.

No, we are not finding that equipment and services are commercially available. The tower owners have presented unreasonably burdensome rent increase demands which, if accepted, would seriously impact our ability to remain operationally upright. We have attempted and continue to try to negotiate acceptable alternatives which is contributing to the delays we have experienced. For the core, we continue to await delivery of key server components. Availability of qualified vendor installation personnel has been an issue. Other than pressing each vendor for timely responses to the needs of our project, there is really little we can do. "You simply cannot get blood from a turnip".

While the burdens of this program continue, so do the overall issues of trying to meet the consumer demands and expectations in an ever evolving, capital and technology intensive business sector. This replacement mandate is putting areas that are persistently behind in such regard further behind because of it. The issues raised in recent ex-parte filings regarding the nit-picking difficulties in processing reimbursement claims should be diligently reviewed and immediately addressed with a viewpoint of "what's reasonably in the best interest of all" versus a "strictest compliance" standard. Likewise, reasonable modifications to the program rules to allow participants to use available funds to make reasonable improvements in services offered (e.g. adoption of O-RAN and upgrades to 5G to address the wide-ranging policy objectives of "better, more secure broadband for everyone, everywhere") should be adopted. And finally, the matters of what will happen should congress fail to come through with appropriations to fund the shortfall need to be brought to the forefront of current discussions and debates.
